Red Deer woman faces charges after an investigation by Red Deer RCMP. Police allege that the suspect stole just over one million dollars while employed at ATB Financial. Sylvan Lake RCMP began an investigation in August 2017 after receiving a report from ATB alleging an employee forged a customer's signature and obtained a loan in that person's name. RCMP say the investigation has uncovered loans obtained by using information of clients and other people known to the suspect for a total of $\$ 1,148,020$. The employee was terminated as a loan officer when allegations surfaced. Sarah Miles Brouilette, 38 was charged and is to be in court July 17

- Vegreville Armed Robbery Two people entered the Garden Inn Motel in Vegreville at 2 a.m. on June 13-one armed with a handgun and the other with a long barreled firearm. They approached a staff member at the front counter and forced her to the bar area. They demanded a safe be opened and stole over $\$ 2,000$. They fled in a newer black Ford F150 with out-of-province license plates. No one was injured. One suspect was approximately six feet tall, has a husky build, wore a black coat, face mask, glasses and gloves. The other suspect may be female, slightly shorter, wearing a hat, face mask and a dark coat. Earlier that night a male and a female were in the hotel asking staff a variety of questions and walked around the building multiple times. They left without renting a room. Police say they may have been targeting the motel before committing the robbery.
